Dear members of the SMRC community,

February 4th World Cancer Day will have a special meaning this year, as we reflect on what it means to live with cancer during a global pandemic. I'd like to first honor oncology patients, for their ability to find

the strength to fight cancer during the worst of times. Their courage and resilience are what prevent us from getting discouraged. World Cancer Day is also an opportunity to thank health care professionals that fight this battle alongside the patients. Their dedication in making sure cancer treatments are provided in a dignified manner despite COVID-19 restrictions is impressive. Their ability to rapidly develop new and creative ways to safely (and often more efficiently) care for cancer patients is inspiring.

Oncology represents a priority area for our Research Centre, and this month's newsletter reflects our contributions to the fight against cancer. The cancer clinical

trials program continues to grow under the leadership Dr Langleben. St-Mary's Hospital and its Research Centre now offer 18 active trials, covering the most common tumor sites: lung, breast, colon and bladder. These trials make innovative new treatments rapidly accessible to our patients and also consolidate St-Mary's role as an academic hospital. Recent partnerships with the McPeak-Sirois and Q-CROC collaborative trial groups will allow us to continue in that direction. Beyond treatment, the SMRC also focuses on the experience of patients and their loved ones with this terrible disease. We are all familiar with the e-IMPAQc research program lead by Drs Lambert and Faria, which focuses on how technology can help patients become true partners in their care by taking ownership of the management of often overlooked symptoms such as distress. Another example of patient-centered cancer research is the Can-Direct initiative lead by Dr McCusker, that showed how a remote, telephonesupported self-care intervention decreased depression and anxiety rates among cancer survivors. I'm proud to report that Dr McCusker's findings have been accepted for publication in the prestigious Journal of Clinical Oncology. Overall, SMRC researchers received more than \$750,000 in cancer-related research funding in 2020. Of course, all of this would not be possible without the St-Mary's Hospital Foundation. We are grateful for their support as the Research Centre continues to consolidate St-Mary's role in academic medicine.

CanDirect: 219 study completers and what's next





The CanDirect trial, funded by the Canadian Cancer Society and led by Dr Jane McCusker and her team, has wrapped up with 219 study completers. The study evaluated an innovative self-care approach for cancer survivors with symptoms of depression, and involved a set of tools plus telephone coaching by a trained lay

coach. Participants allocated to receive the intervention had significantly better outcomes after 6 months than those receiving usual care: reduced severity of depression and anxiety symptoms, improved mental health-related quality of life, and improved confidence in self-care. A paper has been accepted for publication in the Journal of Clinical Oncology. A webpage containing the intervention materials will be made available soon.
